



# Greenland Connect North & Greenland Connect

Tusass' two submarine cables from 2008 connect Greenland to Canada and Iceland. Greenland Connect North from 2017 connects Nuuk to Maniitsoq, Sisimiut, and Aasiaat. Iceland's and Canada's submarine cables are connected to the international telecommunications network.

## Submarine cable Safety

There is a **200-meter protection zone** on each side of the submarine cable, where dragging fishing equipment, anchors, sand suction, and rock fishing is prohibited. If a ship catches the submarine cable, the following procedure must be followed:

- Do not attempt to pull the fishing equipment or the anchor free from the submarine cable

## Enlighten the following:

- Ship name
- Ship call sign
- Name of the captain
- Ship's position
- Water depth
